**Fraser, William G.**

 DELMAR — William G. Fraser, 73, died Tuesday, May 22, 2001 at St. Peter's Hospital, Albany. He was born in Oak Park, IL, the son of the late J. MacGregor and Melrose Wilson Fraser. He grew up in Oak Park and was a graduate of New Trier High School and after school entered the Navy, serving in World War II.

He was a graduate of Dartmouth College, Hanover, NH with a BA in Sociology. He was a member of the Glee Club, Handel Society, Dartmouth Outing Club and Kappa Kappa Kappa Fraternity and a member of the Dartmouth Club of Northeastern NY and secretary of the Dartmouth Club of Baltimore, MD. He graduated from the American College, Bryn Mawr, PA with designation as a Certified Life Underwriter. Member of Golden Key Society of American College. He was general manager of Aetna Life & Casualty Division until 1990 and previously was with Connecticut General Life Insurance. He was past president of Eastern NY Chapter American Society of CLU's and past president of general agents and managers council of North Eastern NY. Mr. Fraser was a 35 year member of the American Red Cross, actively involved in establishing the first Red Cross Regional Blood Program serving Eastern New York, the first Albany Area Chapter recipient of the Clara Barton Award for meritorious volunteer leadership and received the J. Spencer Standish, community ser-

vice award. Mr. Fraser was a member of Albany Rotary Club since 1961 and was president in 1990-91. He received Rotary International's Paul Harris Fellowship in 1991. He was also a member of the Salvation Army for 20 years and was named Member Emeritus in 1996. He was on their advisory board for all 20 years.

Bill is survived by his wife, Nancy Codling Fraser; a son, John W. Fraser, Delmar; a daughter, Ann F. Stedl, Seattle, WA; a grandson Scott M. Fraser. He was predeceased by a daughter, Barbara Lynn Fraser.
