OBITUARY CARL L. GLASSBERG

Carl L. Glassberg died on February 28, 2019 in Clearwater, Florida. He was a senior accounting and finance consultant who volunteered his talents to his Dartmouth class as its treasurer and as a long-time member of its executive committee. He and his late wife Irene never missed a class reunion. Their son Andrew and his wife Barbara were both members of Dartmouth's class of 1980.

Carl and Irene were widely honored for their many years of service on behalf of Holocaust survivors. Irene was herself a survivor. They were active contributors to the U.S. Holocaust Museum and the Holocaust Museum of St. Petersburg, Florida. Among the organizations recognizing their dedicated volunteerism were Gulf Coast Jewish Family and Community Services and the Tampa Bay Lightning hockey team which named Carl a community hero.

Carl grew up in Manchester, New Hampshire. He was a Mathematics major at Dartmouth and graduated from the Tuck School. He was a member of Phi Beta Kappa and received his degree with highest honors. Following service as a Corporal in the U.S. Army he earned a law degree from Fordham University.

He joined KPMG Peat Marwick and became a senior tax partner in the firm's New York and Cleveland offices. He chaired the tax committee on pensions of the American Institute of CPA's. Its work led to landmark ERISA (Employee Retirement Income Security Act) legislation that protected pensions and expanded pension coverage. He retired in 1983 following a major heart attack and settled in Florida where he and Irene loved to play tennis.
