DAVID S. KRIVITSKY

David S. Krivitsky died in New York City on February 19, 2019 after a long illness.

Dave's rare loyalty, kindness, generosity, and sense of fun were greatly admired by his many friends. He loved Dartmouth, his life in Manhattan, weekends with his late wife Maria on Long Island, good food, and world travel. A classmate serving in the same destroyer squadron with Dave during their Navy duty in the early '50s recalls pulling into port on several occasions and receiving semaphore messages from Dave's ship with the message "How about dinner in Paris (or Capri, or Madrid) this weekend?"

Throughout his life he supported many worthwhile causes, most notably the West End House Camp in Allston, Massachusetts where he was a camper, counselor, and its youngest Director.

He came to Dartmouth from Brighton, Massachusetts and Worcester Academy where he captained the track team and was a national champion schoolboy sprinter. He also captained Dartmouth's track team and was a member of Casque & Gauntlet, Pi Lambda Phi fraternity, and Green Key.

Dave spent a long and illustrious career in New York in the textile industry, mostly in the field of women's intimate apparel where he served as president of Native Textiles Company. He was honored by his peers as Man of the Year and received the prestigious Femmy Award from the Underfashion Club.

He is survived by his companion, Rena Lustberg, who brightened the last 12 years of his life.
