OBITUARY PAUL R. STALEY

Paul R. Staley died on January 5, 2018. He had been a long-time resident of the Philadelphia area, most recently in Media. He is survived by his wife Joan, 4 children, 2 step-children and 9 grandchildren. His brother Alan was a member of Dartmouth's class of 1954.

Paul was an especially active and contributive member of his class as an undergraduate. He captained the football team, was a member of Delta Tau Delta fraternity and Casque & Gauntlet senior society. He was an officer of the Undergraduate Council, the Inter-Fraternity Council, and his class. He was also a member of Green Key and Palaeopitus. He went on to earn a law degree at Harvard and was for 3 years a U.S. Naval officer in the Seabees.

Building on his love of engineering, Paul rose through the ranks of manufacturing management at Proctor and Gamble Company and later at Pennsylvania Quartz (PQ) Corporation where he became the Chief Executive Officer. PQ is a producer of silicate and engineered glass materials. He had a widely-admired ability to think outside the box, authoring a book entitled "Questioning the Corporate Hierarchy."

Paul served on the boards of several corporations as well as the Conference Board, the National Vision Foundation, the Upper Main Line YMCA, and the Township Planning Commission in his hometown. He was a member of Dartmouth's Alumni Council from 1966 to 1969 and an active Alumni Fund volunteer.
