William H Terry, whose career was devoted to film and television production, died on August 31, 2018. He was a resident of Silver Spring, Maryland at the time of his death.

Monica Mountains Trail Council, as a literacy volunteer in the San Fernando schools, as an Ambulance Corps paramedic in New Jersey, and at the Strathmore Music Center in Maryland.

His wide-ranging interests included flying (including in vintage aircraft), model trains and swimming.

Bill is survived by 3 children and 4 grandchildren . His father, William E. Terry, was a member of Dartmouth's class of 1921.
