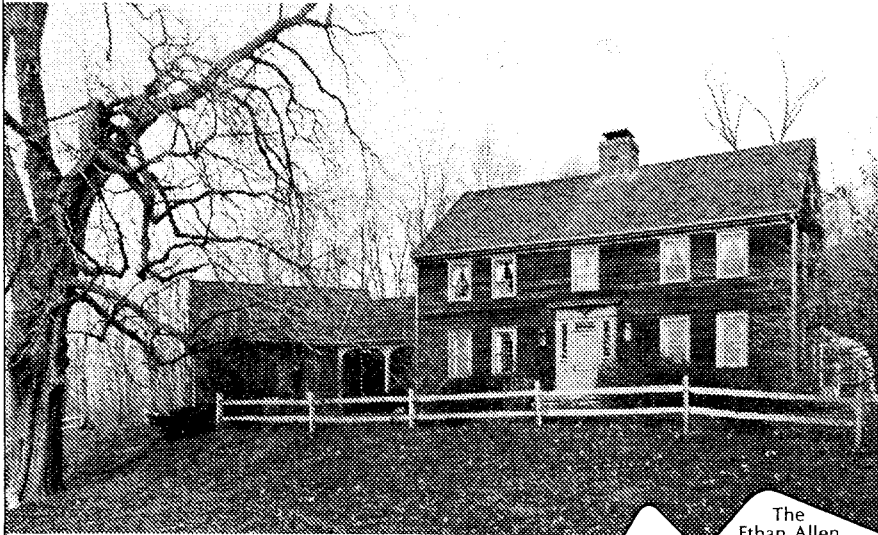

GEORGE HERBERT BARLOW, chief judge of United States District Court for New Jersey, died

March 4, 1979, parently of a heart atta He served on the Fed bench with great dist tion for nearly ten ye In its obituary concern George, the New Y Times wrote, "C fronted with some of most controversial New Jersey crim cases, Judge Barlow quired a reputation for humaneness and a sense justice. Robert J. Del Tufo, U.S. Attorney for N Jersey, said, 'He had great grasp of the law and he also a fine gentleman. He dealt with everyone fa and courteously.'"

George received his law degree from the Rutg University Law School in 1948. After practicing and holding various public law positions, he was pointed to the Mercer County Court in 1962 and to New Jersey State Superior Court in 1966.

He is survived by his wife Jane, two daughters, J Purgavie and Elizabeth Barlow, both Smith Coll graduates, and a son, George H. 3rd '75. His bro is Judge Richard J. S. Barlow Jr. '48 of the Supe Court of New Jersey. Among others of Geor family educated at Dartmouth are his father nephew, and two brothers-in-law.

Judge Barlow was an active College alumnus served on interviewing committees for more than years. At Dartmouth, he was a member of Sphinx Phi Gamma Delta. He served in World War II a lieutenant in the U.S. Navy.
