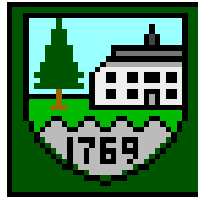

 Subject: BUDDY SYSTEM: The "A" List

Here is the opening salvo to the creation of the "recruitment" system -- hereinafter "The Buddy System" -- by which I believe we can bring back to Hanover and Stowe in 06/06 the great bulk of men (with their wives or partners) -- or, instead, as the case requires, their widows -- who MATRICULATED with us in September 1952. That is the standard -- Matriculation -- and, tho admittedly this will lead to certain impossibilities of reconstructing long-disrupted communications lines, those are the only impossibilities we are going to recognize in pursuing our goal of pursuing every last 56er who (a) can still pronounce, which requires remembering, his own name and (b) can at least drag one leg behind the other, crawl at least as fast as Swe' Pea [A glass of Nobile in the Blue Tent to the first classmate who recollects to me who this is.] or can manipulate either a manual or an electrical wheelchair without maiming any infirm Classmates who may happen to be nearby.

Actually, this "opening salvo" has been preceded by a good deal of spadework: During 2004 I spoke to nearly 100 (1/6 of the still extant) Classmates whom I had identified as "difficult", or at least uncertain, based on a 47-year record of non-participation on a number of fronts. The response was astoundingly good, which helps account for my optimism, and this was generally true among graduates and non-graduates, as well as among those who left before the end of Sophomore and those who hung on until the 11th hour. Part of the reason for this seems to be that most of those who left early did so for "personal" reasons -- missing girlfriend; Hanover ain't Malibu --or Kansas -- finances; getting drunk with a Penn and a Harvard buddy and enlisting in the marines [Derry Evans] -- things like that. So, bottom line, anyone we can contact is "fair game".

So Step One, this step and the main one, is to communicate with the "A" List (which will follow shortly) and enlist them to do the rest.

Who are the "A" List? Quite simply, they are the 242 who are definitely [Inche-Allah, i.e., should they succeed in living so long] coming to Reunion. How do I know? Because I say so; that is they have either confirmed to me that they will or their past behavior renders it extremely improbable that they would fail to come. These folks, unless they are absolved by an asterisk, are asked to pick two or more Classmates who are NOT on this list but instead on either the "B" or "C" lists (about which more at the end of this communication), and do whatever it takes, including bringing them (as, e.g., Jack and Janet Tamagni will be doing re Roger Compton), to get them to Hanover [June 9-11] and, if possible, Stowe [June 11-13].

Those who can still do math will (quickly or slowly) recognize that there is a degree of redundancy in this "system"; that is, if everyone participates, some Bs and Cs will get more than one call -- to which I respond: What's bad about that? If a person has yet to have made up his mind, it should help more to know that two or three of his Classmates, rather than just one are urging him to do so in the right way. I do, however, admit that this has its limits, so I will be playing a "gatekeeping" role - stepping in where more than three have declared their intention to go after the same man, and working the list to assign someone to any B (Likely to decide to come: probability greater than 50%) or C (Not so likely to come: probability of 25-50%) Listers who happen to get "overlooked" in the first round; and, of course, ANYONE and EVERYONE is encouraged yet again to develop whatever information they can on any of the 58 MIAs identified earlier. [This is now down to 58, as Bill Sherman has reported that he sees Jack Greenwood regularly, and Paul Aichele has somehow managed to come back from the dead.]

I ask all the "A"s to let me know by email, phone (617-723-7395), FAX (617-973-9938) or snail mail whom they will be contacting. I will manage the "master list" and weed out excessive redundancies and fill gaps as mentioned above.

So, "A"s, here are the rules: (1) decide who you want to go after; (2) let me know (as well as checking in with me if you want to discuss anything and reporting outcomes); (3) go do it: and (4) drag 'em there if necessary. Also, feel perfectly free to work across the A-List to shore up intentions, make plans, etc. -- for example, Al Booth and Butch Leavitt each mentioned to me that he sure wanted to see the other at Reunion (so, see to it); Buddy Schattman will see to it that Dick and Jacqui Hlavac make it from New Zealand, even if he has to provide the transportation; The Tamagnis' and Comptons' joint planning has been mentioned; and of course there are always the Three Musketeers from Syracuse.
