Alvin M. Krutsch passed away Saturday, September 7, 2002, in his Denver home at the age of 64. He was born in Denver, Colorado on March 25, 1938. He was a graduate of West High School, class of 1955, where he was an outstanding athlete.

He then attended Dartmouth College, where his athletic excellence earned him the honor of captain of the college's first Ivy League championship football team. He was also a member of the Dartmouth Rugby Club, which was named to represent President Eisenhower's "People to People Program," playing rugby in England. He graduated in 1959 with a degree in History.

He returned to Denver to begin his career in mortgage banking. He was involved with Delta Mortgage and Midland Mortgage and is a past President of the Colorado Mortgage Bankers Association. His adventures in life took him to all corners of the world, and included saltwater and fly-fishing, pheasant hunting, and reading.
