“Edward Warner “Ted” Gude, 66, died Tuesday at Alice Peck Day Memorial Hospital in Lebanon. He was born in Summit, N.J., on Aug. 1, 1937, the son of Walter and Adrienne (Louis) Gude, and attended Summit High School. He was a member of the Dartmouth College Class of 1959 and later studied at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and the London School of Economics.

He was a professor in Dartmouth's government department before his professional life took him to Chicago and Washington, D.C., where he was an analyst and researcher for the Stevenson Institute, the Department of Defense and Raytheon Corp. He also worked as a stockbroker for Bache and Co. and E.F. Hutton.

When he returned to the Upper Valley in the early 1990s, he served as acting executive director of Headrest Inc., a residence house for those in need of drug and alcohol treatment; a member of the New Hampshire Licensing Board for Alcohol and Other Drug Professionals; a member of the Intervention and Treatment Task Force of the Governor's Commission on Drug and Alcohol Abuse; and vice chairman of Friends of Recovery - New Hampshire. He was a volunteer at many drug and alcohol treatment programs and a friend and mentor to numerous Upper Valley residents who sought help with addiction.

Survivors include a son, Ken of Washington; his former wife, Kathryn of Washington; and a sister, Barbara McGlaughlin of Mountainside, N.J. Calling hours will be held tomorrow from 6 to 8 p.m. at Ricker Funeral Home in Lebanon. A Mass of Christian burial will be celebrated Saturday at 10 am at Sacred Heart Church in Lebanon, with the Rev. Gilles Genest officiating.
