Jay L. Frankel died October 8, 2005. Jay, who was divorced many years ago and had no children, is survived by his loving companion Lynore Aaron, his mother, Sylvia Frankel, and his sister, Diane Meany. He was born September 23, 1927 in Stamford, CT

Jay prepared for Dartmouth at St Luke's School in New Canaan, Connecticut. He was a History major. Jay came from a family of Dartmouth alums including his father, Julian, '32, his cousin David Frankel '60 and another cousin Stephen Osman, '56.

According to his close friend and classmate Steve Levine, at Dartmouth Jay presided over his own eating club, forsaking Thayer Hall in order to dine at select eateries in the Upper Valley. Ponzi's, Golfside and West Leb's Lobster Pond are examples where he regularly ate with Bob Friedman '59, Ted Rosenthal '60, and Steve.

When asked his occupation at our fifth reunion, Jay responded in his whimsical and wry way that he was a "retired businessman!" For the past forty plus years, his occupation was actually overseeing family financial interests.

Jay lived in Stamford, CT. He had unending infatuations with the New York Yankees and cars (he owned an assortment of Corvettes and Thunderbirds). For the past seven years Jay and Lynore enjoyed life together, among other things traveling extensively and devoting time to her five children and grandchildren.
