Budget Reductions:

**Nearly one-half million out of a
departmental budget of about \$16 million**

Good News:

- Percentage cut not as deep as most departments.
- No varsity sports eliminated, per President Wright.

Not So Good News:

- Two positions eliminated (Asst Ticket Mgr, Fitness Center Coordinator)
- Significant operating budget reductions in all areas.
- Heavy reliance on endowment income and annual giving could mean a total reduction of \$1 million annually in overall resources, requiring much more belt-tightening ahead.
