As a valuable pitcher on the Dartmouth baseball team, you threw strikes when needed. During the past six decades you have represented team Dartmouth on numerous levels. You have been a DCF class agent since graduation, a 1961 cohead and head DCF class agent for many years and for several reunions, and a recent 4-year member of the most senior Dartmouth College DCF Committee. In 2010, you were presented with *The Stephen F. Mandel '52 Society* award in New York for outstanding alumni volunteer effort and visionary leadership with respect to the College's DCF efforts.

In your application essay to Dartmouth, you stated that you "At an early age, I found defeat very hard to take." That is clear. You assembled a large team of classmates, assigned them all reunion-related functions, got approximately 45 classmates and spouses/widows to formally participate in various reunion seminar/discussion//entertainment groups, and planned out to the minute each of the reunion programs for each of the four days of the reunion. When you learned that our 60th Reunion could not be live, you didn't skip a beat. You simply shifted gears and changed direction, holding the longest (4 days) and most event-backed virtual reunion in Dartmouth's history. The end result?
