
Frederick Raible Baumann

Frederick Raible Baumann On March 18th, 2006 Fred passed away at the age of 66, in his home in Hood River, OR. He had worked for the State of Oregon and independently as a discrimination investigator traveling throughout the US. He had battled cancer and been in remission for 16 years.

Fred will be remembered for his sharp wit, affinity for mischief, fondness for dachshunds, his consuming interest in eight-man football of Oregon and Montana, his passion for open roads and forgotten towns of the Great Plains and Deep South, and the postcards he sent.
