* As a sophomore, Mike was a member of the Dartmouth teams that toured both England and California during the 1958/1959 school year. He was a sturdy member of the scrum, and was actually the first of the 19 Dartmouth lads to play in England. Dartmouth's first game was played against Dick Liesching's hometown team of Haslemere. When putting a team together to play us, one of Haslemere's other teams that day was short a player, and Mike (aka "Moon Man") volunteered to play for Haslemere in a game that preceded Dartmouth's first game in England on Sunday, December 14, 1958 (that game being the first time a U.S. <u>college</u> team had played rugby in England).
