2) Additional information provided by his brother Norman. After Dartmouth he attended the Univ. of Minnesota, graduating with a degree in philosophy. He then moved to DC to theology seminary, deciding, after one year, that this was not what he wanted. In 1963 he started working, as an orderly, at hospital for the criminally insane run by the Federal Government in DC. Over qualified for this, I think.

In 1970 he took a computer class which cost him \$2000. Quite a bit of money at that time but resulted in a job with the Department of Defense. He worked in the Navy accounting office helping them set up the computer accounting system and was their main "computer guy" until retirement in 1994. He took early retirement, with a bonus, because of staff reductions caused by military downsizing at that time.

He had gotten into boating, sailboats, and spent his retirement in boat club activities, sailing schools, etc..

After he was diagnosed with Parkinson's, he moved to Houston Texas in 2007 to be near our sister there. Her situation changed so he moved back to Minnesota in 2012. So he ended up 12 miles from the place where he grew up.
