Died: July 25, 2003

Bill died of a heart attack at 64 years old on Friday, July 25, 2003, at the Mayfield Country Club, where he had been playing tennis not far from his home in Gates Mills, Ohio.

He grew up in Shaker Heights, Ohio, and went to high school there, where he had played football, been on the swimming team, and was captain of the track team. He was also on the student council.

At Dartmouth, he majored in economics, was a member and president of Sigma Alpha Epsilon, and was in Casque & Gauntlet. He served on the undergraduate and inter-fraternity councils, and was on the track team for four years, played rugby for three years, and was in the outing club for three years. He earned an M.B.A. degree from Tuck Business School, and then went to Harvard Law School.

Over the years he practiced law, did some management consulting, was a principal with a company that developed medical diagnostic equipment, and sold real estate for many years, which was his occupation at the time of his death. He grew up and lived most of his life in communities near Cleveland — Shaker Heights, Beachwood, Chagrin Falls, and Gates Mills.

One of his numerous hobbies was woodworking; others were curling, scuba diving, and skating. Among family he left behind was a daughter named Kimberly.
