

## Barry H. Fentin

Barry H. Fentin, who founded Fentin and Goldman, a law firm in White Plains, NY, and then served as its managing partner, died on December 12, 2012.

His funeral was on December 17th at Westchester Reform Temple, where he served for six years as a member of the Board of Trustees.

According to his entry in our 50<sup>th</sup> Reunion Book, "Paths We've Taken," his extracurricular activities included membership for seven years on the school board of the NY Union Free School District.



As an undergraduate, he was a history major and a member of the marching band. According to the reunion book, his favorite faculty member was Dr. Wing-Tsit Chan, who "studied the developments in the Far East pre-World War II and the developments leading up to what would be the Vietnam War."

After Dartmouth, he went to Boston University Law School, graduating in 1965.
