Howard passed away on Wednesday, January 7, 2009 at his vacation home in Florida. He was 69 years old.

He came to Dartmouth from Maplewood, New Jersey, where he went to Columbia High School, graduating with honors and first in his class. He was on the school newspaper there, in dramatics, and played basketball.

At Dartmouth he majored in English, was on the golf team all four years, and on Greensleeves as a junior and senior. He was named a Rufus Choate scholar. Following Dartmouth he studied English at the University of California at Berkeley, and then at Columbia University, but shifted plans and went to Harvard Law School, from which he graduated cum laude in 1966.

For most of his professional legal career he engaged in the private practice of law in Cranford, New Jersey, about eight miles from where he grew up in Maplewood and approximately 30 miles from where he and his family lived, in Freehold, New Jersey. His areas of emphasis as a lawyer were tax law, and personal estate and real estate law. His other interests included golf, opera, good books, and trips to Las Vegas and the Bahamas.

Howard's wife Marcia predeceased him, and they had two sons, Seth and Micah.
