Died: September 15, 2003

Hank died peacefully on Monday, September 15, 2003 after a brief pulmonary illness. He was 64 years old.

He grew up in Beaver Falls, Pennsylvania, and graduated from the Hill School in Pottstown, Pennsylvania, before coming to Dartmouth. At Hill he was on the Dean's list, in dramatics, wrestled, and was captain of the football team.

Little is known about his life at or after Dartmouth, as he left before graduating. He graduated from Allegheny College in 1961, and then went to the University of Michigan Law School, where he received his J.D. degree in 1964.

He practiced law for most of his career in Pittsburgh, with areas of emphasis in natural resources and property law. He was Managing Counsel of the Pittsburgh office of Dinsmore & Shohl, LLP, and General Counsel of the Pennsylvania Coal Association. Among other professional activities, he was a Trustee of the Energy and Mineral Law Foundation, and a member of the board of directors of the Pennsylvania Landowners Association. He was named Distinguished Coal Lawyer of the year in 1998 by the National Mining Association, and was known as a vocal advocate for the rights of private property owners.

An obituary on the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette notes that Hank enjoyed music, was an accomplished golfer, and tennis and squash player, and was skilled in the culinary arts.

Hank had a son Henry, and three daughters, Suzanne, Sarah, and Alice.
