

George W. Lampl Jr.

Died: April 18, 2009

George passed away suddenly of heart failure at his home in Mays Landing, New Jersey, on Saturday, April 18, 2009, at age 67.

He grew up on Staten Island where he went to high school, and where he was active in student government, holding the offices of section president and treasurer. He was named to membership in Arista, an honor society.

He matriculated at Dartmouth when he was 16 years old, and majored in economics. He was a member of Sigma Phi Epsilon (which for about 14 years was known as Sigma Theta Epsilon). After a leave of absence during our junior year, he returned, and graduated cum laude in 1962, with distinction in his major field. After Dartmouth, he studied economics between 1962 -1964 on a fellowship at Brown University. Following the completion of his graduate coursework, George left the east coast for the west.

He married and accepted employment performing economic forecasting and analysis for the then new Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) System in San Francisco. His daughter Jennifer (Dartmouth '87) was born in 1965 and his son George III was born in 1966. In 1968 after the completion of his thesis, George was awarded his M.A. degree in economics from Brown.

George moved back east to Boston in that year, accepting a position with the investment-counseling firm of Scudder, Stevens & Clark, Inc., where he developed an expertise in bond investing. He later had careers with David L. Babson & Co. and the Boston Company Asset Management, LLC.

George loved classical music, especially music composed by Brahms and Schumann. He was a big fan of Philadelphia's sports teams and had a particular love for the Phillies, who he was able to see win the World Series in the fall before he died. During the last years of his life, he cared for his mother on a daily basis, enabling her to remain in her home. (She turned 103 years of age in 2010).

George was survived by his mother, his brother John, his two children, Jennifer and George III, and three grandchildren.
