Al died in New York's Memorial Hospital (Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center) after a long battle with cancer on Saturday, December 6, 1975. He was 36 years old.

Al graduated from the Bronx High School of Science in New York, where he was a member of the National Honor Society, on the student council, newspaper, and yearbook. In athletics, he was on the tennis and track teams, running cross-country on the latter.

He majored in history at Dartmouth and was Vice-President and Rushing Chairman of Pi Lambda Phi. He served on the undergraduate council, was on crew for one year, and on the staff of The Dartmouth all four years. He was also a member of the pre-law club for four years.

His obituary in the Alumni Magazine records that Al went to Yale Law School, and then practiced with the New York law firm then known as Strook & Strook for three years. He left to work for Goldman Sachs, where he was an associate at the time of his death.

Vic Rich, a close friend and fraternity brother, is quoted in the Alumni Magazine obituary as commenting, "Al will always be remembered by his fraternity brothers at Pi Lamda Phi and his classmates as an individual who stated his mind openly and did what he thought should be done — always a leader, never a follower."

Al had two children, Jeremy and Jordan.
