

James Murray Styles

Died: June 30, 1975

Jim died unexpectedly on Monday, June 30, 1975, in Weyauwega, Quebec, an obituary in the Alumni Magazine reported the following September. He was 36 years old.

Jim was born in Montreal, raised in Quebec City, and went to the New Hampton School for Boys in New Hampton, New Hampshire. He was president of the student government there and vice-president of his class in both his junior and senior years. He was in the band and the glee club, on the yearbook staff, and was a member of the debate team. His sports were boxing, football, hockey, and track.

At Dartmouth he majored in history and was a member of Sigma Chi, serving as its rush chairman. In his first two years at the college he was on the dormitory committee.

After he left Dartmouth, the obituary reports, Jim entered the field of municipal bond trading, working first with Continental Illinois National Bank & Trust Company in Chicago, then the investment banking firm of Allan Blair & Company, then joining Walston & Co, becoming a vice-president there in 1968.

Jim returned to Canada in 1974, where according to the obituary, he purchased and operated his own business in Weyauwega.
