

## **Arthur Enrique Tullar**

Died: August 3, 1991

Art died of an apparent heart attack at the Bursa University Hospital in Bursa, Turkey, on Saturday, August 3, 1991. He was 51 years old. Bursa is a province in Western Turkey with a population of about 2.5 million, and is about 150 miles south of Istanbul.

The news of Art's death, and the facts of his career, appear in a published but unattributed obituary found in college archives. Art was born in Brooklyn and lived in New York City until he was six years old, it says. His parents (his father was an engineer) then moved to Caracas, Venezuela, where he grew up. He attended the American School there, was on the newspaper and yearbook, and graduated with honors.

At Dartmouth, Art majored in English and rowed crew for two years, becoming team manager. He was in the outing club for four years and in the Ledyard Canoe Club for three. He was a member of the Dartmouth Christian Union and was a youth group leader at Hanover Junior High for one year.

About Art's life and career after Dartmouth, no other information is available other than what appears in the obituary. There is no entry for him in our 25<sup>th</sup> Reunion Yearbook in 1986.

Art became a teacher, and for 30 years held numerous posts and taught a variety of subjects. He taught European history, Asian history and philosophy, math and English. He taught in Chelsea and Versa in Vermont, and Santa Monica. He founded or headed private day schools in Santa Monica and Vermont. He led student groups on study tours to Great Britain, Europe, the Middle East and Egypt, the obituary reports.

In 1990 he left the U.S. to teach math and English at the Gursoy High School in Istanbul, and worked at a summer camp in the Uludag Mountains near Bursa.

Art had three children, Tara, Christopher, and Alice.
