We have already Registered 45 for the Virtual Sesion and 15 will attend in person,


Classmate Panelists

As we mentioned last month, three of our classmate panelists will be geologists Jim DeLong, Norm Page, and Art Bookstrom. The other classmate panel will include **John Ratigan** and **Pani Kolb**.

After Dartmouth and Yale Law school, John Ratigan joined the State Department as a Foreign Service officer, serving in Tehran, Singapore, Cairo, Toronto, and Seoul.

John's first assignment was at the US Embassy in Tehran, where his principal job was to interview tourist visa applicants. He liked the back-and-forth of the interview process and sorting the credible from the not-so-credible.

Later, while in Cairo, John read that bills were being introduced in Congress to reform US immigration laws. He asked to be assigned to either the House or the Senate Judiciary Committee's



Immigration subcommittee, each seeking passage of reform legislation. John was given a one-year assignment as Counsel to the Senate immigration subcommittee, chaired by Wyoming Republican Senator Alan Simpson in the fall of 1984.

John will talk about his work on the subcommittee, and his own drafting of a bill that became law, and how the Congress was able to pass four significant immigration bills between 1986 and 1996. He will look at why no major immigration bill has been passed since 1996, and why prospects for future immigration legislation are not promising.

Carolyn "Pani" Kolb, a lifelong Louisiana resident, graduated from Newcomb, the former women's college of Tulane University in New Orleans, and married New Orleans native Ken Kolb.

While in college she hung out at the library's jazz archives and followed jazz bands in street parades and funerals. After graduating and marrying, she worked as a reporter at The Times-Picayune, kept up with her music interests, and in 1966 became director of the New Orleans Jazz Museum.

With a Master's degree in History and a Doctorate in Urban Studies/Urban History,.



she's taught Louisiana history at Tulane and has written several guidebooks to the city However, it's music that has enriched and sustained her and her famed home and what she continues to love and write about.

Pani will share about her time with the New Orleans Jazz Museum and provide insights into the true American artform—Jazz.
