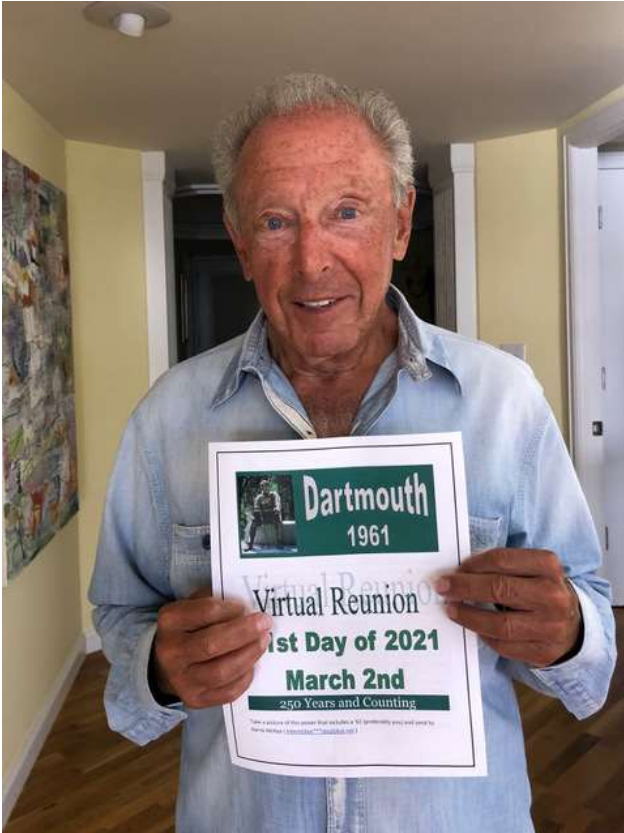
Classmate Panel

One of our classmate panels will include **Jean DeHaven** and **Gerry Kaminsky**.



Jean DeHaven will tell us about the year-long project of making a quilt in her late husband Ken DeHaven's memory. As she states, "I started painting classes at age 60, loving every moment of it. Oil portraiture moved my heart. Commissions came my way, but art has infused my life in multiple ways. And being a pack rat was easy for me. Saving Ken's many silk ties was one of them, along with all the other things that might come in handy for some project, . . . sometime for something? Those ties moved from home to home to home with all the other things. But finally, at age 82, those silk ties made it into my latest creation, honoring Ken

,—"The Ties That Bind". This was my 1st quilt. My trials were many, and I changed the meaning of the traditional quilt with the help of Ken's friends."
