**BRUCE PACTH** writes: “Not many news tidbits from me, as I have been working my nuts off for the last 16 months trying to understand the field of affordable housing. We just closed on financing for a \$25 million, 120-unit mixed income, mixed rental and ownership development called Gile Hill, located in Hanover, just off Medical Center Drive. The effort began in 1999, then picked up speed when Hanover Town meeting voted to give up to 25 acres of the “Gile Tract” to a not-for-profit corporation for affordable housing development. Twin Pines Housing Trust was the designated entity. We hired our development partners in early 2004, and until last week, were working on pre-development (plans, permits, financing).

“Trumbull-Nelson Construction Company, Inc., of Hanover, is the construction manager. Larry Ufford '67, is T-N's president and CEO. We're blasting, crushing, excavating and building roads and utility trenches right now.”

**LARRY BARCELLA** is now in private practice with the Washington office of the Paul Hastings law firm. He begged off getting together by saying ‘[i]nterested in lunch but probably not for a while. Still defending the 41 year old single mother of three in the former Soviet Republic of Georgia. . .making me probably the only lawyer you know who’s actually appeared in court in BOTH Georgias – okay, a small distinction, but it’s mine.
