MINUTES: MEETING OF THE DARTMOUTH COLLEGE CLASS OF 1968 COMMITTEE, 2/10/24

Treasurer now proposes a donation of \$2400K to the Athletic Scholarship Fund and \$124 to Sarah Bapti; both are approved.

ALUMNI COUNCIL: Woody Lee reports that the council has been relatively inactive lately. He anticipates more news in May.

NEWSLETTER: Deadline for next issue submissions is April 25. Delivery will be in May, after GAR presentations at next class dinner. (Later in this day's meeting the
