Warren F. Cooke '68 has been an avid photographer since 1959, when he got his first camera.

Two stays in France under the Dartmouth Foreign Study Program; a job right after Dartmouth as a professional interpreter (French) for the US State Department; a 38-year career in International Law (including 9 years in Hong Kong); and work as a Member of the Board (and Chairman) of The American Bird Conservancy and as a Trustee of The Nature Conservancy (NJ) — not to mention his role as a father of 3 and grandfather of 4 — have all served to deepen his photographic habit.

Warren has extensively photographed France, Southeast Asia, baseball, firefighters in action, and particularly wildlife, with a special emphasis on birds of the Americas.

This small sample of his photographs focuses on the wondrous diversity of women around the world.
