

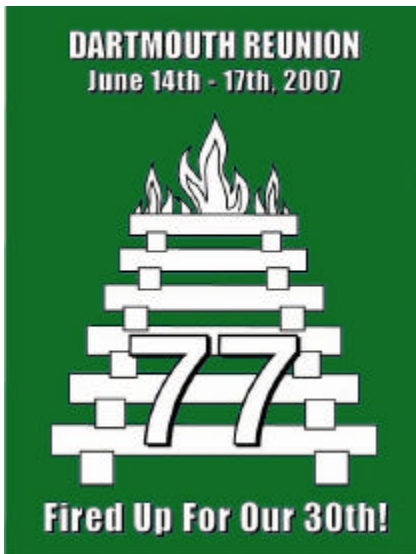

Dartmouth Enjoys Most Successful Fund-Raising Year Ever \$160 Million in Gifts—48.3% Participation by 1977s

Dartmouth College celebrated its most successful fund-raising year ever with \$160.3 million in charitable gifts in the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2006. The result was 51 percent greater than in 2005 and more than one-third higher than the previous record of \$118 million, set in 2004. Significant growth in participation from College and graduate school alumni and friends and strong support for the goals of the Campaign for the Dartmouth Experience accounted for the totals.

"We're grateful for the energy, enthusiasm, and generosity of our alumni, parents, and friends," said President James Wright. "Their gifts demonstrate a commitment to Dartmouth's historic mission-to provide the finest educational experience in the country. The participation of alumni is the best news of all."

The Campaign for the Dartmouth Experience has raised \$738 million as of July 31. This is 57 percent of the \$1.3 billion goal, realized over 54 percent of the campaign timeline. 1977's participation rate this year was 48.3%, thanks to:
