

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS- CLASS OF 1999 20th REUNION

When does our reunion take place?

Friday June 15-Sunday June 17, 2018

Are we sharing our reunion with other classes?

Just like our 10th and 15th Reunions, we are part of a Reunion Cluster with the classes of 1997 and 1998. We will share many events with those classes, including our late-night socializing in the Cluster Tent on Lord Lawn. However, both Friday and Saturday dinner will include only members of the Class of 1999.

How much does Reunion cost?

Early bird rates are effective through April 9th, 2018. We encourage you to register at this time as it makes it easier for the committee to plan meals, events, etc.

Dartmouth Alum and any adult guests: \$225

Teens: \$120

Juniors (6-12): \$140

Toddlers (2-5): \$35

Infants: free

April 10th- June 1st, adults will be charged \$245. Any adults registering after June 1st, including walk-ups Reunion weekend, will be charged \$265. Children's rates will remain the same.

What does that price include?

Dartmouth charges our class for every person who attends Reunion, to cover the costs of our tent, security, and all the events they plan for the weekend, including events on the Green both Saturday afternoon and evening. Your Reunion registration fee also covers all meals for the weekend (Friday dinner, Saturday breakfast, Saturday lunch, Saturday dinner, and Sunday breakfast), all alcohol and beverages, snacks and games in the tent, and all souvenirs. Activities planned by our Class are paid out of your registration fee, as are all the student workers who help keep our reunion running smoothly. THE REUNION REGISTRATION FEE DOES NOT COVER ON CAMPUS HOUSING.

Is Financial Aid available?

We don't want anyone missing Reunion because it doesn't fit into their budget. Therefore, we are offering two levels of financial aid. For those who need it, the Class of 1999 will cover the full cost of Reunion. There is also an approximate ½ price rate of \$125 per adult, and \$65 for juniors and teens (infants and toddlers would be free). What if my spouse/partner and I are in different classes in the cluster?

We know there are a few of you with spouses and partners in other classes. If this is the case, you should register with the class whose Saturday night dinner you choose to attend. Therefore, if your spouse is a '97, and you want to eat Saturday dinner with the Class of 1997, you should register as the guest of your spouse. If instead you want to split up for that dinner and eat with our class, you should register with the Class of 1999. If your '97 or '98 spouse chooses to eat Saturday dinner with you, he or she should register as your guest.

Will reunion be all kid-oriented?

When you register any children between the ages of 6-18, they are automatically registered in the Reunion Kid's Program. We encourage you to take advantage of the wonderful things the people running the Kids Programs have planned for the weekend. This includes Friday and Saturday dinner, as well as sports, arts and crafts, field trips to the Montshire Museum, and lots of other fun activities. Information about the Kids Programs will be mailed to you around the time registration opens.

The majority of the weekend will be family friendly. However, children are not welcome at the Saturday evening class dinner (the exception being nursing babies and newborn infants), or the late-night activities in our Cluster Tent. For many of us, reunion is an exciting event for the entire family. For those of us without children, or who do not bring our children, it is an exciting event for us and our friends. We have sought to achieve a balance for all classmates, whether or not they bring children to reunion.

Will reunion be all alcohol-oriented?

One change from the 15th Reunion is that liquor has been banned from the Dartmouth campus. Therefore, only beer and wine will be served throughout the weekend. It will be available at the tents for late-night festivities on both Friday and Saturday evenings, at both Friday and Saturday dinners, and the receptions that precede them. Some may choose to drink a lot over the weekend, some not at all, but there are plenty of activities that do not involve drinking.

How can I know if my friends are coming?

The registration home page for the class of 1999 will contain a link to view everyone who has registered for Reunion. Note, however, that during the registration process, some classmates may choose to not have their names published on this page.

What should I wear?

Reunion is mostly casual, with people often dressing up (sundresses, skirts, button downs, khakis, etc.) for Saturday dinner. Remember June can still be chilly in New Hampshire, especially late at night and early in the morning, so bring a hoodie, cardigan, or windbreaker to keep warm.

What should I do when I arrive?

Come check in at our cluster tent on the Lord Lawn. Then, if you are staying on campus, check in at your dorm.
