D.O.C. MOOSILAUKE MOUNTAIN DAY TRIPS/OVERNIGHT

Feeling the need to do a little hiking when you're back for reunion? Missing the Lodge Crew? Wanting to relive your freshman trip...or better yet experience your first one? Well don't delay...the Moosilauke Ravine Lodge will be open for '99s on Friday, June 18-19 for an overnight stay or day trip to delight. **Spaces are limited so register today!**

Friday: Afternoon, Check in at the Lodge
5:00 pm Reception with munchies and setups provided (BYO beer, wine or liquor)
6:30 pm Sumptuous dinner by the lodge crew
8:00 pm Songs, stories, dancing or meeting old/new friends (Bring your instruments!)

Saturday: 7:30 am Breakfast at the Lodge
9:00 am Pick up bag lunches – With check out time for the Lodge is 12:00 noon

Friday Overnight: Stay at the Ravine Lodge. There are bunk beds with foam mattresses and sheets, blankets and towel are provided. Men's and women's toilets, and hot showers are available in the Lodge building. If the Lodge is sold out, you can still join in the fun and stay close by. Directions for reaching the Lodge and to find your own lodging nearby can be found on the back of this flyer.

Saturday is a day of free time to roam the trails, climb the mountain, or just hang out with friends. Then drive to Hanover in the afternoon to check in for your reunion. **If you plan to hike, come prepared with a good pair of hiking shoes, a jacket or sweater, some sort of raingear, water bottles and bug repellent.** Questions can be directed to the Alumni Relations Office at 603-646-2337.

On **Friday, June 18 and Saturday, June 19**, transportation will be available for people who wish to hike Mt. Moosilauke. A bus will depart from Webster/Rauner Hall at 9:00 am and return to campus at 5:00 pm. The five-hour round trip climb to the Summit of Mt. Moosilauke offers excellent views of Vermont and New Hampshire as well as the surrounding White Mountains. The trails are well marked and most hikers find that five hours is a sufficient period of time to walk to the summit and back. In addition, trail maps will be provided with the suggested route marked. Or, if you prefer, you can relax at the Ravine Lodge, swim in the Baker River, and enjoy shorter alternate hikes. Experienced hiker or not, there is a day here for everyone. A parent must accompany children under 13 years of age.

Reservations will be confirmed on a first come (money received) basis. Space at the Lodge is limited for overnights and for people joining for just meals. **Cancellations must be received by the office prior to June 1. Cancellations after June 1 will forfeit payment. Directions to Moosilauke

From Boston or I-93, take I-93 to exit 32; turn right (west) on 112 and follow it through North Woodstock; turn onto Route 118 is about 3 miles from the center of town. Follow 118 7.2 miles to the Lodge access road (big brown signs on right)

From Hanover or I-91, take I-91 to exit 15; go east from the interchange; turn left on 5, then in about 1/2 mile go right across the river on 25. Turn RIGHT on the New Hampshire side of the river, go 1/2 mile, then left onto 25A. At the end of 25A turn left onto 25/118, follow this through Warren village; on the other side, route 118 forks right; sign for "Moosilauke Ravine Lodge 5.8 miles." Follow 118 5.8 miles to the access road on left. This is about a 2 – 2 1/2 hour ride.

Once on the Lodge road, follow it to the end, about 1.7 miles; turn around there, and park on the right side of the road. Cars should be locked.
