Analysts now commonly argue that the United States is a declining power and that we are entering a "post-American" world. In the first talk, the Professors will show that the United States remains, and will long remain, by far the most powerful state in the system. They will then argue that the demand for United States leadership in the international system will not go down.

In their second talk, they will review how the current conventional wisdom about United States foreign policy is off-base in four different respects. Specifically, they will argue that: (1) the United States will still be strongly tempted to pursue unilateralism in the short term, (2) in the medium term, the United States may strongly pull back from the global economy and overseas military commitments, (3) the security threats facing the United States are not greater than in the past, and (4) the international problems facing the Obama administration are not intractable.
