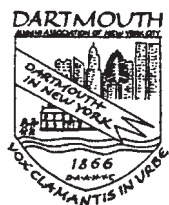

Annual Alumni Seminar in NYC:

Walking the Tightrope: When U.S. Economic Policies Intersect with National Security Interests.

Dive into two hot topics, Economics and Security, at the Annual Alumni Seminar. This year's seminar, *Walking the Tightrope: When US Economic Policies Intersect with National Security Interests*, will be conducted by Daryl Press, Associate Professor of Government on Saturday, January 24th.

Economic affairs are increasingly impacted by national security concerns. The connection between these two pillars of government is particularly evident in the Middle East, where dependence on Persian oil binds the U.S. to a violent region.

The half-day seminar will address questions like the degree of the United State's dependency on oil from the Middle East and viable alternatives to our current foreign policy.

Professor Press's research focuses on U.S. foreign policy, crisis decision-making, military operations and strategy, and the links between energy and U.S. national security policy.
